WELCOME ADDRESS

I warmly welcome you to the 2022 National Project Management Conference & Project Management Excellence Awards. It is with great pleasure and privilege to be hosting you the key drivers of our economy.

As you are aware, this year's event theme is "Making Project Management Indispensable for Business Results". What is the relationship between project management and business results?

Initiatives, plans, policies, strategies, etc. in many offices and government agencies continue to gather dust and remain undone. The results from initiatives, strategies, plans, policies, etc. can only be realized or achieved through the efficient and effective performance engine of Project Management otherwise, organizations, businesses, etc. will suffocate and die. This is what Project Management Institute (PMI) means by the "Project Economy". The "Project Economy" is one which people have skills and capabilities they need to turn ideas into reality". It is where organizations deliver value to stakeholders through successful completion of projects, delivery of products, and alignment to value streams. This is not strange as project management is a globally recognized approach to complete projects within planned budget – time and cost; as well as delivering agreed product and service.

Let us look at some successful project management example:

1. American Airlines – the airline merged with US Airways and created an overlap in technology and programs. They recognized spreadsheets were inadequate for managing resources and complex projects. They adopted portfolio and resources management for time entry, resource management, and capacity planning. They gained visibility into broader divisional and global priorities and went from capitalizing 10% of their IT labour to 20% – equating to a multi-million dollar

net positive impact on their balance sheet.

2. The Royal Bank of Scotland (RBS) – their need was to establish consistent, reliable data to inform financial and resource decisions. What did they do? They adopted portfolio and resource management to drive consistency – they were able to do away with having data in different formats and hundreds of projects managed by different systems. This resulted in delivering on their business case and achieving return on investment within 12 months. They also improved on transparency and reduced costs in each business unit

3. Projects submitted by MTN, BOST, ECG, Vodafone, ABSA, SMEC, Automation Ghana, and others to this year's Project Management Excellence Awards is a huge indication of the recognition and adoption of project management methodology in Ghana.

Policy makers, Heads of Departments, Executive and Senior Management staff gathered here today, and for the next two days, we invite you to partner with the Project Management Institute, Ghana and begin applying the knowledge, skills and techniques of project management to deliver exceptional value returns to your organization.

The 2022 National Project Management Conference will showcase trends, innovations and “must haves” in the industry. Additionally, you will be equipped with relevant skills and techniques to deliver business value to your organization. And the 2022 Project Management Excellence Awards will celebrate excellence in project executions that delivered exceptional business value.

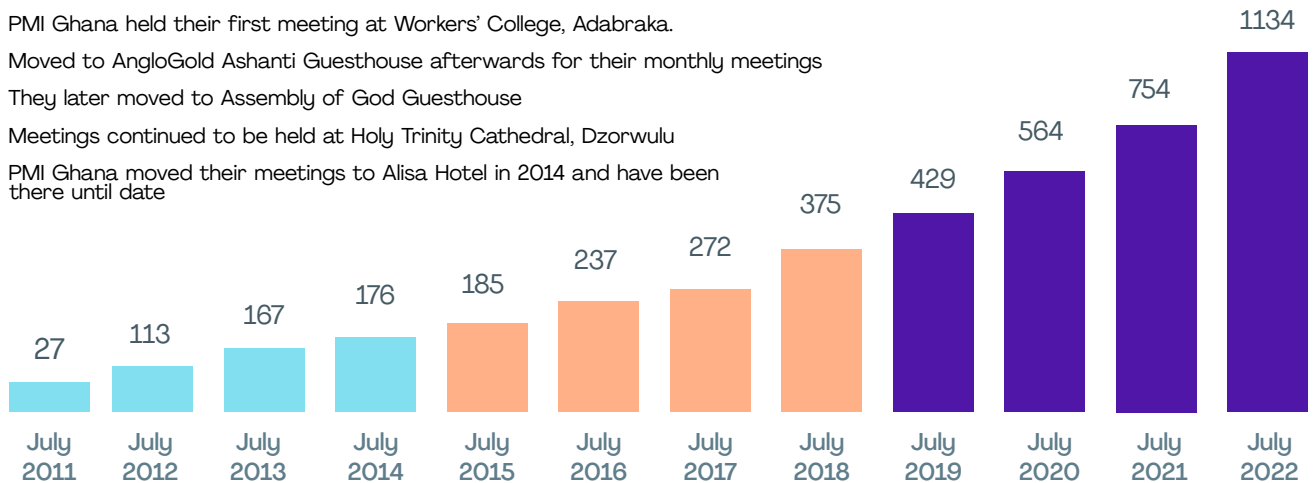

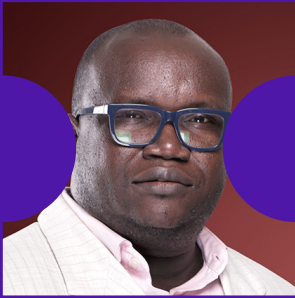

Dr. Moses Adoko is currently the Chief Knowledge Officer (CKO) at the NASA Goddard Space Flight Center. Prior to his appointment as the NASA Goddard CKO, he served as Deputy Chief Knowledge Officer for the entire NASA agency. In that capacity, he led efforts aimed at ensuring that the agency's technical workforce and practitioners have access to critical, technical and relevant knowledge to increase the likelihood of mission success. He led programmatic efforts aimed at ensuring that implementation of NASA's vision and strategy is backed by well-researched policies and proven technical practices that enable mission success across the agency.

Dr. Adoko provides program management oversight for institutional activities involving external partners and collaborators. He also serves as coordinator/ administrator of the NASA Goddard Senior Fellowship program, a scientific and technical advisory committee that advises Center leadership on issues related to science, technology and engineering research investments and strategy. The NASA Goddard Senior Fellows Program is made up of distinguished scientists and engineers, recognized for their accomplishments and contributions to the nation's (US) space program.

Dr. Adoko has over twenty-one years of working experience

The Bulk Oil Storage and Transportation Company Limited (BOST) was incorporated in December 1993 as a private limited liability company under the Companies Act, 1963 (Act 179) with the Government of Ghana as the sole shareholder.

BOST's mandate is to:

- *Develop and maintain a national network of facilities for the bulk storage, transportation and distribution of petroleum products in Ghana.*
- *Build strategic reserve stocks of petroleum products to meet a minimum of 6 weeks of national consumption.*
- *Import petroleum products to ensure fuel security in the country and export to neighbouring countries to improve revenue.*

In fulfilment of its mandate, BOST has developed a network of storage and pipeline infrastructure throughout the country. The Company currently has six (6) Depots nationwide. These are located in the Accra Plains, Mami Water, Akosombo, Kumasi, Buipe and Bolgatanga. Refined petroleum products (i.e. diesel and gasoline) enter the BOST network from either the Conventional Buoy Mooring (CBM) at Tema and/or from the Tema Oil Refinery (TOR). Petroleum Products are transported between BOST coastal depots and inland depots using a combination of pipelines, river barges and bulk road vehicles (BRVs).

BOST's Vision is to be the number fuel and logistics company in West Africa by 2024.

BOST's Mission is to manage the business of storage and transmission of fuel focusing on excellence in security safety and profitability.
